#### Women at the Well

Exciting things are happening with Women's Ministry at Good Shepherd! A small group of women have been meeting over the winter with the goal of reaching more women at Good Shepherd. As a result of those meetings "Women at the Well" was formed.

We hosted an input meeting on February 4, open to all women at Good Shepherd. 35 women attended, and most of the

attendees indicated a willingness to help or serve in some way. We could not be more excited about what God is doing!

From the input meeting we identified 5 common themes. Women need **encouragement**, **community**, **care/support**, **rest**, and **spiritual growth**. To meet those needs, Women at the Well is developing four main "buckets" for women to get involved:

- 1. Bible study
- 2. Mentoring/small groups
- 3. Events
- 4. Caregiving

It is our prayer that God will use these avenues to reach women in our church and community.



Thank you to everyone who attended the voter's meeting on February 16 regarding the sale of the Redeemer property. The congregation voted to sell to the Seventh Day Adventist church for \$275,000. Steps are being taken right now to secure earnest money, perform a building inspection, and sign a purchase agreement. A closing date will be determined in the near future, possibly the end of March.

It is time to prepare this year's ballot of candidates for our May Voter's Meeting. We will elect two people to serve 3-year terms on the Executive Team beginning July 1.

#### Legacy Ministry Fund

The merger of Redeemer's endowment money to Good Shepherd's fund is complete. The total in the fund is \$405,222 with \$46,947 designated to music ministry. The remainder is undesignated; generated income can be used to support various ministries at home or abroad.

Dallas Ketchum, Steve Schmidt and Roger Johnson from Redeemer have been added to the committee. They bring awesome skills to help with the LMF management. This year we will use Good Shepherd money for our distributions and Redeemer money for some of Redeemer's ongoing ministry disbursements. The longer term focus is to totally integrate the funds for disbursements of grants.

Accordingly, from Good Shepherd's funds we granted the following awards:

- \$1,000 to Scott Scholljegerdes, a student at Concordia College in St. Paul who is working toward the seminary.
- \$1,800 to upgrade hardware for our sanctuary projection system
- \$700 to McKayla Graves who is building outside playground equipment that will enhance our children's ministry program. McKayla is active in our youth program.

Stay tuned for news on other disbursements in the near future.

We are excited about the growth of the fund! It will provide many opportunities over many years to do great things for our church and extended ministry. Thanks to everyone who has or may be considering leaving an investment legacy to the Fund. 
